

JOB ANNOUNCEMENT

BASIC EQUIPMENT OPERATOR

WAGES: \$21 per hour, Depending on Experience, Training, & Qualifications

TYPE: Full-Time, Year-Round with Comprehensive Benefits,

DUTIES:

Operates a variety of heavy and light equipment to support the District's landfill operations utilizing loaders, scrapers, dozers, compactors, skid steers, forklifts, excavators, motor graders, etc. Performs and documents daily pre-trip and post-trip inspections and greases all equipment in accordance with policies, procedures, and established preventative maintenance intervals. Implements landfill best management practices in accordance with landfill permits and District policies and procedures. Works under a safety-first mentality while maintaining a safe, organized, and clean working environment; identifies, reports, and supports the elimination of hazards.

REQUIREMENTS:

High school diploma or G.E.D. with a minimum of one year of experience in heavy equipment operations. Three or more years preferred with knowledge, training, and experience in complex heavy equipment operations utilizing a variety of heavy equipment. Ability to perform basic math computations such as cubic yardage, volume of cylinders and rectangles, calculation of weights (e.g., pounds to tons), rounding; ability to be trained to operate construction equipment; some knowledge of general maintenance and repair. Applicant must be at least 18 years of age and must hold a valid driver's license and have a clean Motor Vehicle Record (MVR). Must be able to pass a pre-employment DOT physical and Drug and Alcohol test. Must be legally eligible to work in the United States. Must operate in accordance with established Health and Safety policies and procedures, DOT (Department of Transportation) requirements as well as all local, state, and federal laws. Ability to work outside where the applicant may be exposed to varying and potentially extreme weather conditions, noise levels, dust levels, odors, construction environment, potentially hazardous or toxic waste, and related items that may be present in municipal solid waste. The employee is required to attend safety and training sessions and perform other duties, as requested.
